





Motion by Dustin, Second by Tamijo to approve Minutes of March 19, 2023 meeting. Motion passed.

Motion by Maddy, Second by Dustin to approve Treasurer's Report. Motion passed.

Pastor Janet gave her Pastor's Report. In-Person church attendance has been 45-60 people since Christmas and online worship continues to have over 200 views per week. She will be preaching at NeSoDak Bible Camp on July 2nd at 11:00. See full report below:

-Glad to say attendance has been better the last few months. Easter we had 110 people!!

-I will be preaching at NeSoDak on July 2^{nd} . Do we want to ask everyone to come out there again. We wouldn't have to with then 8:30 service this year, but wanted that to be an option.

-Ukrainian sponsorship idea- we could piggy back along with Grace Lutheran in Watertown or even possibly Florence if they end up doing it. Just something to talk about.

Had 2 funerals this month- one for an unchurched family at a funeral home and one for Florence.

I taught 1st communion class at both Florence and Summit. We are rescheduling the 1st communion celebration because weather made us not have worship on Maundy Thurs.

Lent was tough as we got in less than half of the services due to our horrible winter and bad roads.

I am our Conference Dean and our conference was the one to host this year's Spring Theological Event for the South Dakota synod (our state). Colleagues from all over SD came to Watertown for it. I was in charge of the planning and everything so that was hard the week after Easter. It turned out well and 100 pastor's attended.

We received more checks from people who attend our worship online- both from people who have never attended in person and some from our members who only watch online most Sundays. This continues to happen on a pretty regular basis. We are thankful!

Traci gave update on new church website options. Motion by Billi, Second by Tamijo to use WebHostingHub for website server and ACSTechnologies for website templates and church management. Motion passed.

Annelies gave update on sanctuary/fellowship hall doors. Tony Kneeland from Glass Products Inc. was out to measure.

The siding project was discussed. Dustin & Ben are going to work on a Request for Proposal. They have the names of several contractors interested in the project. Laura & Carrie are organizing a group to fundraise. Pastor Janet will lead a Paint & Pour event on Sunday, April30 at 4:00 pm to kick off the fundraising.

Annelies gave an update on the boilers. Both boilers have been serviced. Boiler #1 is in use and Boiler #2 is turned off. New Nest Learning thermostats have been installed in the sanctuary, entry, and fellowship hall.

Motion by Billi, Second by Dustin to accept the bid from Valley Office Products to lease a Xerox color copier. Motion passed

Motion by Billi, Second by Dustin to pay the 2023 CCLI license fee. The Florence Parish paid it in 2022. Motion passed.

Graduates & Sunday School teachers will be honored during worship and the men of the congregation will serve muffins, fruit, juice, and coffee after the service.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I read a quote yesterday that said, "Working in a church is saying, "but after this week, things will slow down a bit" over and over until you die".

The quote made me laugh because it is true. I tend to wait for the "after" time. After Lent is over, things will seem lighter, the weather will be better... after Easter is done, the planning and worry for worship will be less and the weather will be better... after Spring Theological Event is over, I will feel more relieved, and the snow will all melt... After the snow is gone... after the water dries up... after the funeral is over... after council is done... The list of "after" is never finished. There is always something to wait for, to plan for or to worry your heart over.

Last week, I was helped some with my "after" worry. I was at the Spring Theological event for pastors. I was in charge of the planning committee and of making sure things ran on time. I was worried about food deliveries, speaker logistics, piano players, worship leaders, and anything else I could dream up to worry about. All the worry and the stress made it hard for me to sit down and take in the speaker or worship with the group.

I was standing in the back of our venue for the day, Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer. To the back of their sanctuary sits a large, square baptismal font made of concrete. It had a beautiful waterfall and water pool inside it. A little red headed daughter of one of our conference pastors was standing by the font with me. She eyed the water curiously. I watched as her father whispered to her about it, then touched the water and made the sign of a cross on her forehead. This delighted the little girl! The act made me smile. The little girl shared my smile and after wriggling from her father she stuck a finger into the font and reached for me. I leaned down and in her sweet voice she said, "God bless you!" then she made a cross on my forehead.

I was stopped in my tracks on my journey of the "afters". The thing that mattered in that moment was the blessing from God given by the cutest little girl you will ever meet. Now...this little girl...this moment of blessing mattered.

To my amazement, the next morning as I hustled into the conference with my head full of what needed to happen, I was met by the same little girl. With her grin and a wet finger, she welcomed me into the day with another, "God bless you!" and a cross on my forehead. Her smile warmed my heart all day long.

As we journey into the busy month of May, many of you worry over graduations, confirmations, end of school year events, scheduling summer vacations, finding summer daycare, etc. After this, I can plant my flowers...after this, I can take the time to rest I need... after this, my work schedule should get better...after this, I will have more time with my family... The "Afters" can become our worry and our focus and we can forget to stop and enjoy the beauty God is blessing us with today.
