

Gift of Grain

With the tax law changes in 2018 many people think that charitable donations are not tax deductible. Yes, donations are still deductible, but...... The standard deduction was raised from \$12,700 to \$25,900 per couple. People who itemized their deductions (mortgage interest, property tax, health costs, charitable donations) in 2017 might find that the standard deduction in 2022 is larger than the itemized list. This can make it feel like the donations are not deductible.

Farmers have a special charitable donation option available to them. A Gift of Grain reduces income before any itemized deductions. It can be used in addition to the \$25,900 standard deduction. The Gift of Grain can also reduce the self-employed payroll tax.

A donor should always consult with his/her tax preparer to determine the tax implication prior to making a gift. The following information is not to be construed as specific tax advice.

How a Gift of Grain Works:

- 1. The farmer completes a Letter of Understanding and then delivers the grain or agricultural commodity (ex. livestock) to the elevator.
- 2. The farmer asks the elevator to transfer xxx bushels/tons to Hope Lutheran Church.
- 3. Hope Lutheran Church receives the elevator receipt and pays any subsequent ownerships costs such as storage, etc.
- 4. Hope Lutheran Church authorizes the sale and collects the proceeds from the commodity.
- 5. The farmer includes the production expenses on his/her tax return, but NOT the income from the sale of the gifted bushels. The farmer does not take a separate charitable contribution itemized deduction on the amount of the sale.

NOTES:

- 1. Gifts of Grain are available only to cash basis farmers.
- 2. Crop share landlords cannot gift grain.
- 3. The farmer must give up "dominion and control" of the commodity.
- 4. The farmer cannot sell the grain and direct the elevator to send the check to Hope Lutheran Church.
- 5. Hope Lutheran Church assumes all risk after the transfer. The church must direct the elevator when to market the grain. The Hope Lutheran Church Council has decided to sell all grain upon delivery. Please notify the church prior to delivering any grain.
- 6. The gift should be from unsold crop inventory. No sale commitment should be made prior to the gift by the farmer.
- 7. The crop should not be under lien to bank or other entity.



I'm writing my article on Summit's homecoming week. It's been fun to look at the playground and view children dressed in the colors or special style of the day. My favorite is always pajama day.

It can be a really fun week at the school. Beginning with coronation and ending with a parade then the football game. Most of us remember the times of float making and marching band with fond thoughts.

Have you ever wondered abut the point of all the homecoming activities? The earliest school "homecomings" began at the college level in the early 1900s. They were devised as a way to bring everyone who was an alumni back and boost school spirit. Homecoming was an actual coming home. They were invited home to a place they once loved and worked hard for. (It was secretly also a time to attract financial support for the college programs in need.)

It feels like we have lost some of the original intent of Homecoming. After all, other than last years graduates, how many other former students actually come home for the week? Class reunions are held during the summer most of the time. As small towns shrink into smaller towns, there is seldom anything to attract people to come back.

The same problems are felt in church. Since the closings of Covid in 2020, attendance numbers have never returned to the pre-pandemic normal. We will sing God's praises and do God's work in our community and all of his world through our missions. We will remember that "homecoming" isn't always about the past.
