When I was young, there was a sing-song rhyme for the end of the year that went, “no more pencils, no more books, no more teacher’s dirty looks.” It got written on things and sometimes even chanted by particularly naughty kids on the end of the school year. Then, the last bell would finally ring and we were off, running out the school doors into the summer. Someone would always yell, “we’re free...” as we laughed and ran into our time of freedom from school.

Modern kids probably don’t understand the freedom of spare time and running around all summer my generation had. You could get on your bike and just go in our small town. As long as we were home by the town’s 6:00pm whistle, all was good. As we aged, the home time often stretched to- as long as we were home, “by the time the yard lights came on”, or “the 10:00news”. You get the picture.

Pencils and books have been replaced with Chromebook or iPad. Freedom of running the small town outside is replaced with structured time at camps, or ball practice, or time in the car running to and from games or meets. Kids have traveling teams and summer learning events. The scheduled things leave very little time for freedom as we knew it. Now, I know the world is a different place and there are dangers we didn’t even think about when I was young. I also know looking back is always done with nostalgia so I forget the drawbacks. But, I think we’ve given up a lot of freedom in order to keep safe and scheduled.

We can tie our churches and our faith up into the same search for safety and organization. We can live as if having the best education programing, the most organized worships, or the prettiest, busiest churches will pay the way to our freedom and salvation if Jesus Christ. Like our young families’ summer scheduling, the most current and beautiful things in the church aren’t bad things. They just aren’t the most important thing and can sometimes lead us away from the truth. Jesus says, “I am the Way and the Trith and the Light” and reminds us that focusing on anything else as a goal is foolish. Early followers of the church struggled with the idea of how they were mad free from sin and the power of evil. Many were sure it would take a lot of business to get it to happen. But, int eh book of Acts chapter 13, we are told, “Let it be known, therefore, brothers and sisters, that through this man (Jesus), forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you can not be freed by the law.”

Freedom doesn’t come from things outside of us or things we do, it comes from who we have in our hearts. The gospel of John reminds us, “If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.”

So, this summer, let’s search for what real freedom is. As you enjoy the heat of a new season, bring the joy of being free and forgiven by our Savior with you. Make a life in him your focus... and be free.

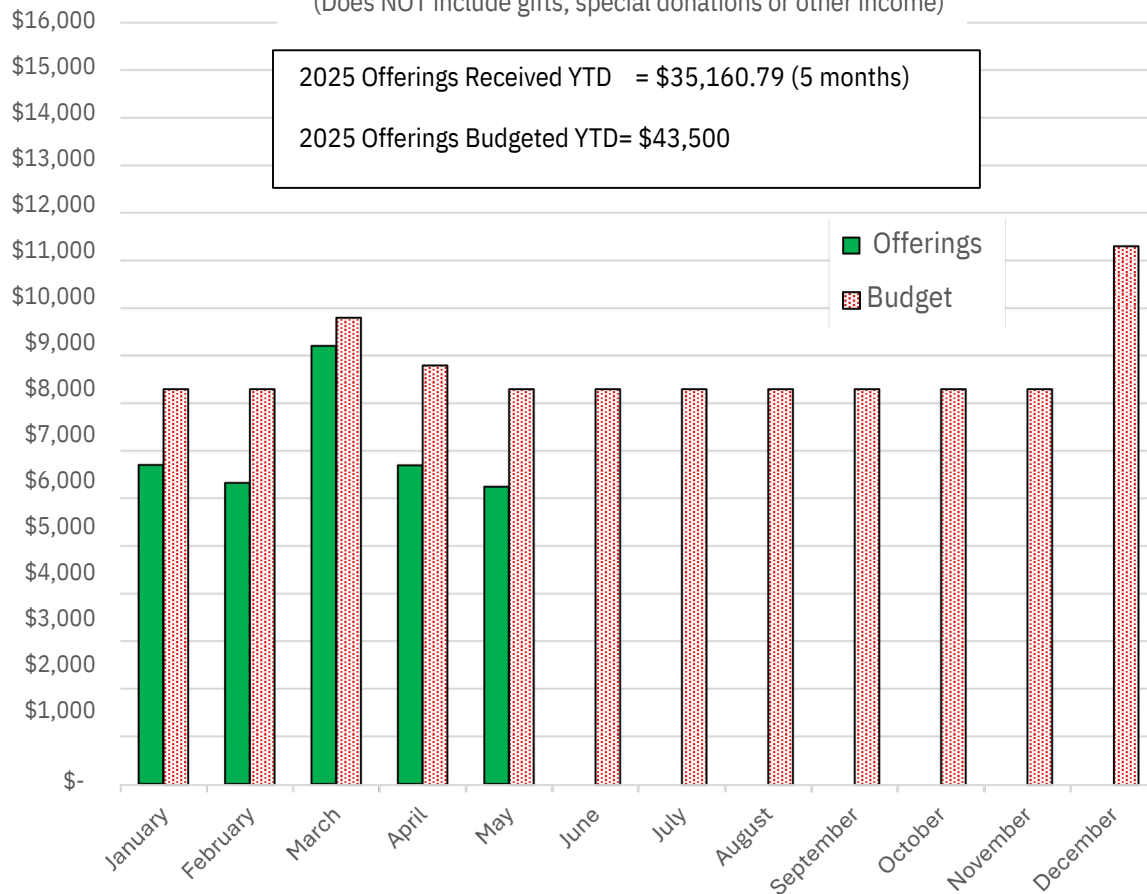

Easter reminds us that through the grace of God we have been given new life in Jesus Christ. The ministry of St Dysmas is based on God's promise of forgiveness and redemption. We get to walk with men through some of the most difficult times in their lives to let them know they are known, loved, and valued by God. We believe people can change, and we believe a person is never defined by the worst thing they have ever done. Not only does God love them, but God is calling them to do God's work in the world.

One of the most inspiring parts of this ministry is seeing men grow in their faith and start reaching out to help others. I think of Victor. Victor is a large, imposing kind of guy—the kind of guy you would fear meeting in a dark alley. But he is all heart; he is there to listen and pray with guys around him. He is part of a prayer group on the inside where a number of guys meet together and pray for the challenges they and their families are all facing.

As a pastor, I've had people thank me for "bringing God into the prison," but that's simply not true! God was already there; God is never far from us and is always at work among God's people. No prison can keep God out. What we get to do is help people to see God's work and recognize how the Holy Spirit is at work in their lives. When the world wants to tell them their life means nothing, Christ shows them that new life comes from death.

The tomb was empty...He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Hallelujah!

Friends and supporters of St Dysmas of South Dakota, Jesus Christ calls us to preach and teach that we have a God of mercy and love and that there is nothing, absolutely nothing, in all of creation that separates us from his love and his promises that come most specifically in his Son, Jesus Christ. God puts death to death, for you...

As an Easter people, we give thanks that we are not left for dead, but that Jesus Christ has made each of us new and set us free. New life is known where sins are forgiven and the sacraments are administered rightly.

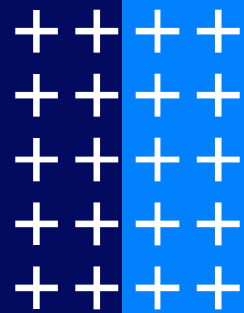
